JUNE 20 - IT'S ALL OVER BUT TO CRY

Louisiana's spirit of survival meets the powers of Hurricane Audrey, the deadliest cyclone in American history. The Arts Council partners with Black Bayou Lake National Wildlife Refuge to feature this Louisiana-directed and Louisiana-made film.

JULY 18 – FIVE AWAKE

Directed by a Louisiana woman, this film follows the fierce efforts of five women who are fed up with domestic violence. The women push anti-domestic violence laws through the Louisiana legislature to protect their sisters across the state. The Arts Council partners with The Wellspring to feature this film.

AUGUST 15 – I AM THE BLUES

The delta is the birthplace of America's music, and this film honors the original men and women who created the art of blues. Filmed across the Louisiana and Mississippi delta, this film explores the music and musicians of the famed Chitlin' Circuit. The Arts Council partners with KEDM to screen this documentary.
